*** There are many resources available to help you. Below is a list of some of these. You can contact your instructor or the Math Division, (256) 549-8322, for more information. ***

- **Cardinal Tutoring Center** – Cardinal Tutoring Center provides free tutoring in Math, English, Psychology, Sociology, History, Computer Science, Art, Speech and Science. Check with your instructors regarding hours for tutoring and location or call (256) 549-8285 for more information.
- **Textbook Software** – Online software is available with many of our math textbooks. This software typically includes practice problems, online help with problems, videos, eText, and more. An example is MyMathLab for MTH 098/100/112/113. The textbook software may have additional costs associated if you did not receive an access code with your text. See your instructor for more information.
- **Student Support Services** – Student Support Services offers free one-on-one tutoring and other benefits for qualifying students. Call (256)549-8375 for more information about Student Support Services on the Gadsden Campus or (256) 835-5465 for the Ayers Campus.
- **Veterans Upward Bound** – Veterans Upward Bound (VUB) offers tutoring and other benefits for qualifying students, including veterans and adult students. - **GSCC Library** – All GSCC library locations house resources and textbooks to help with specific courses and topics. Call (256)549-8333 for more information about library resources on the Gadsden Campus.
- **Blackboard** – If your course has a Blackboard component available, you should explore that course for more help. Many instructors have PowerPoints, Videos, and other resources available in Blackboard.
